However, this one doesn't	
<pre>#!/usr/bin/ruby BEGIN {\$VERBOSE = true} p=1</pre>	
Setting \$VERBOSE to true in a BEGIN block should have the same effect as providing it on the command line, but this is obviously not the case.
